While we close out a church year, we can savor what God has done and celebrate how He has been faithful and present in so many ways. It is undeniable. We have felt, seen, and witnessed the greatness of God. Today, we seize the opportunity to share and report and be a part of His work. That He would use even me, even us, to accomplish His will in some way. For what lies ahead—we trust Him and put tomorrow entirely into His hands, as there is no promise of tomorrow. We anticipate tomorrow, and we hope for it—but we do so knowing that today is the day the Lord has made.

As we hear, receive, celebrate, and feel the challenge of the ministry reports this evening—may we, together, feel the stirring of the Holy Spirit in how He may have us get more actively involved in the furthering of His Kingdom and His Mission. That is what this is really all about. As Oswald Chambers so eloquently put it: "work out what God has worked in."

There is a place and a space for you here. You have abilities, gifts, and skills that no one else has. You were beautifully and wonderfully made. In this coming year, in whatever time God gives us—I look forward to working shoulder-to-shoulder with you to fulfill what He is calling us to. Together, under His guide and direction, we will accomplish great things for Him. Thank you for being a part, for being actively involved, and for giving the Gospel away. I am grateful and humbled beyond words.
